We expect our children in Year 2 to...

- read at least 3 or 4 times per week
- learn their weekly spellings that are sent home on a Monday, ready for a test on Friday.

The following tasks are optional but we encourage that they are completed to further support your child's love of learning outside of the classroom. They can bring in completed work to share with the staff in class and post it onto class dojo.

Reading

We are reading Little Red Riding Hood which is a traditional story. Listen to or read other traditional stories such as The Gingerbread Man, The Three Little Pigs or Goldilocks the three bears.

Writing

Some of our work this half term focuses on capital letters and full stops and adjectives. Our story is "Little Red Riding Hood" It's a traditional tale. Can you draw the characters and use adjectives to describe them.

Mathematics

We are learning to count in 2's, 3's, 5's and 10's. Can you practice the songs at home, using skip counting. Use google to search counting forward and backwards in 10s, 5s and 2s.

Science

Our focus this half term is materials. Can you remember the different materials we have looked at? Can you find materials around your home and tell someone what it is used for?

PE

We're improving our ball skills this half term. Can you use two hands, then one hand, fingertips, feet or toes to control a ball? Can you control the ball to hit a target? How far away from the target can you get.

History

Our topic is The Great Fire of London. We will be learning about the how it started and how people lived. Can you find out any facts about Samuel Pepys

Geography

We will be spending some time looking at London and where it is on a UK map. Can you compare Google to London? Write some information about them.

Art & Design

Create a piece of art linked to the Great Fire of London using, clay, paint, collage or drawing.

Design & Technology

Research 17th century recipes with a parent or carer, just like the cakes we made for Wow day. How did it taste?

Music

Use everyday materials to create a musical instrument. For example, create a rain stick from a kitchen roll tube and rice.

RE

In RE, our current learning focus is 'Lead us not into temptation'. Tell a member of your family what temptation is. Ask them what are their temptations.

We're improving our Internet Safety! Talk to your family about how you can keep safe online.
