We expect our children in F1 to...

- Share a book or favourite story with a grown up

The following tasks are optional but we encourage that they are completed to further support your child's love of learning outside of the classroom. They can bring in completed work to share with the staff in class or you can send up a picture on Class Dojo.

Reading We will be reading lots of traditional tales in school. Share your favourite with a grown up. What is your favourite traditional tale?	Writing We are encouraging the children to have a go at mark making to develop their pre writing skills. Have a go at writing your name. Can you draw a picture of Little Red Riding Hood?	Mathematics We are looking at numbers from 5 to 10 this half term. Count out a set of 10 objects. Have a go at writing all the numbers to 10. Can you find all the numbers to 10 in your house?
Phonics Can you recognise any words that start with the same sound as your name?	Singing Learn the song 'When Goldilocks went to the house of the bears' Try playing a musical instrument to your favourite songs!	Fine Motor Skills Fine motor skills are so important for everything your child does. Make a gingerbread man using some gingerbread dough. Watch out when you cook him – make sure he doesn't run away!
Gross Motor Skills Make your own flappers and show a grown up what to do. You can use a tea towel or some dish clothes for your flappers. Make your moves BIG BIG BIG!	Expressive Arts & Design Go on a walk and collect some sticks or leaves or plants. Have a go at making some art work using what you collected. Take a photo of what you have done!	PSED Sit quietly either inside your house or somewhere safe outside. What can you hear? Ask a grown up to make a list of what you heard or you can draw a picture of them.
Communication and Language Can you tell a grown up the story of the 'Three Little Pigs'? See if you can remember what happens in the story.	Understanding the World Make some porridge like the 3 bears had. What do you like with your porridge? Try some different toppings on your porridge!	Understanding the World Don't forget to carry on looking after your beans! Go on a walk and look for other flowers and plants that are growing. Don't pick them – let everyone enjoy them, you can take a photo of them instead!
Mathematics Can you talk about what your day is like from when you get up in the morning to when you go to bed at night? What do you do first? What happens next?
