We expect our children in F1 to...

- Share a book with a grown up

The following tasks are optional but we encourage that they are completed to further support your child's love of learning outside of the classroom. They can bring in completed work to share with the staff in class or you can send a picture on Class Dojo.

Reading Share some story books or non fiction books with a grown up. Ask the grown up to take some photos of you with your favourite books.	Writing We are encouraging the children to have a go at mark making. Draw some pictures of you and your family. Try to draw round your hand.	Mathematics We are looking at numbers from 1 to 5 this half term. Can you count to 5? What numbers can you see in the environment?
Phonics Go on a listening walk. What things can you hear? Draw some pictures of the things you can hear.	Singing Practice singing the songs 'Tommy thumb' and 'Head, shoulders, knees and toes'	Fine Motor Skills Fine motor skills are so important for everything your child does. Have a go at threading. You can thread pasta onto string or cheerios onto a skewer.
Gross Motor Skills Go to the park and have fun running, jumping, skipping, hopping and climbing. What is your favourite thing to do at the park? Ask a grown up to take some photos of you at the park.	Expressive Arts & Design Make some hand prints or foot prints or finger prints using paint. Or you can just use water and make the prints on the path.	PSED We are encouraging the children to use their manners at snack time. Help your child to use 'please' and 'thank you'.
Communication and Language Go on a walk and use your 5 senses. What can you hear? What can you see? What can you smell? What can you touch or feel? And if its safe – what can you taste?	Understanding the World Look at some photographs of friends or family. Talk about who is in the photos and what is happening in them.	Understanding the World Can you name some body parts? Head, knee, shoulder, elbow, back, neck, eyes, ear, toe, cheek, eyebrow, finger, thumb, hand.
Mathematics Look around for things that have patterns on. Can you find something spotty? Can you find something with stripes?	Physical Development Practice putting your coat on by yourself. We will be teaching the children a trick to help them in school, ask your child to show you this trick!	Autumn 1 F1
